The GL Progress Test in English is a national assessment used by schools to check how well you're developing your English skills compared to other students your age across the country. It will assess:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading – how well you understand different types of texts (like fiction, non-fiction, and poetry), including your ability to find information, understand vocabulary, and make inferences. • Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar (SPaG) – your knowledge of English grammar rules, punctuation, and accurate spelling. <p>The test will be online. You'll answer a mix of multiple-choice questions and short written responses. The test takes about 45 to 60 minutes,</p> <p><u>Success Criteria</u></p> <p>To do well in the reading part of the test, I can:</p>
